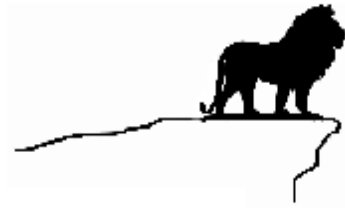


The Bluff Oct 2010



AWAITING CARPET OF WILD FLOWERS

LUMO, as expected, is very dry.

To remind us of the contrast in scenery with the silver grey we have at present, above are some of the wildflowers which we can look forward to enjoying in the short November rains .

The sight only lasts a few weeks but is spectacular and well worth a visit

WATER MANAGEMENT

Only Bura dam still holds water, so the Lumo borehole is providing welcome relief to the wild animals and community livestock.

The dry is an opportunity to dredge the Lion Rock dam and repair Lions Bluff water hole. Research into how best to ensure provision of water in the community grazing zone continues in order that pressure can be reduced from The Sanctuary water and grass stocks.

Longer lasting water is the first step to reviving the residential herds of yesteryear.

COMMUNITY

The Sanctuary must provide a visible benefit to the people who own the land.

With increased occupancy at Lions Bluff we can begin to make a difference

Funds are already marked for bursaries and other projects will follow.

RANGERS

Two more rangers excelled in their training with KWS. This means that we now have 15 highly trained people taking care of the Sanctuary. We work closely with our neighbouring Taita Hills Sanctuary,, running joint anti poaching patrols and awareness creation in schools.

EYE GO GAME SPOTTING 2010 EGGS

EGGS will raise awareness and funds for both the sanctuary and community projects including the new local eye clinic, hence the name.

Teams photograph as many animals, birds, trees and turds on our list within the Sanctuary over 30 hours.

The harder the challenge the higher the points– a leopard is 100 points and an impala 5.

The team with most points wins.

A camp site has been built with catering, bar, community and sponsors tents.

A party complete with face painting, KWS animators, raffle and a disco in the bush is planned for this annual event.

ELEPHANTS AND LIONS

The dry season migration of elephant has brought in numerous family groups with many young. Huge herds of buffalo have kept the residential prides of lion and their young cubs well-fed.

Our rangers from LUMO and Taita plan an identification system so that the lions can be monitored more easily.



NO POISONING

It is apparent that the herders, for their part, are changing attitudes towards the predators. Because they are no longer using poisoned meat to kill the lion we have seen a return of vultures and a marked increase in the smaller predators, such as jackal, hyena and serval.
